



With over 27 years of dedicated experience in education, Camille Banks joins the William Loesche community as a proven leader committed to fostering engaging, inclusive, and high-achieving learning environments.

Most recently, Camille served as an Assistant Principal at Abraham Lincoln High School, where she led the Academy of the Sciences and oversaw the Sciences and Specialized Services department, including all paraprofessional staff. Under her strategic leadership, the Specialized Services department achieved remarkable, quantifiable growth during the **Spring 2026** assessment cycle:

- Academic Excellence (Renaissance STAR): Guided Special Education (SPED) students to a 3% increase in ELA proficiency/advanced scores and a 3.5% increase in Math proficiency/advanced scores, alongside a 7.3% boost in ELA participation.
- Student Success Metrics: Spearheaded initiatives that led to a 5.8% increase in students on track for a four-year graduation and a 0.7% increase in students earning all A's and B's.

Prior to this, Camille was a Professional Learning Specialist for the School District of Philadelphia (SDP), where she supported the Office of Leader Development. In this role, she provided targeted coaching and professional development for aspiring and current teacher leaders, focusing heavily on self-awareness, relationship-building, and advocating for marginalized students.

Camille's passion for teaching ignited at just 12 years old when she began tutoring a neighbor's granddaughter in phonics. She officially entered the education profession in 1999 after earning her Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education (with a concentration in Social Studies) from Delaware State University. She later solidified her leadership trajectory by earning a Master's in Education Administration.

Throughout her diverse teaching career, Camille taught grades 1–6 across multiple prominent districts, including the District of Columbia Public Schools, Prince George's County Public

Schools (PGCPS) in Maryland, and the SDP.

Her leadership journey accelerated in PGCPS, where she served as a Data Coach, School Instructional Team Coordinator, and Principal Designee. Recognizing the power of data and technology in creating inclusive classrooms, she founded "Teacher Tech Tuesdays"—a dedicated space for educators to master instructional technology. After a brief period supporting her family's early childhood learning businesses and working in life insurance, Camille returned to the SDP as a Literacy Lead and School-Based Teacher Leader (SBTL) at Tilden Middle School.

Throughout her nearly three decades in the field, Camille has maintained an unwavering mission: to make learning a fun, memorable, and equitable experience for every child. Outside of her professional life, she gives back to her community by volunteering at her church's pantry, and she enjoys spending her spare time gardening and singing.
